GIOVANNI MEROLA: ART FOR THE PROTECTION OF NATURE

The artist Giovanni Merola possesses a remarkable ability to select subjects that inspire him and to reinterpret them in a unique and transformative manner. This skill of reinterpretation is evident in every one of his works, which becomes a symbol of awareness for the conservation of nature. The artist has chosen to use his art as a means to approach environmental protection and to convey his message to a global audience. His paintings convey a sense of liveliness and dynamism, making it seem as if the subjects and objects depicted are almost emerging from the painting itself. This technique creates an engaging and stimulating visual effect for the viewer, who feels drawn into the work.

Merola's ability to create this sense of three-dimensionality and movement through the use of colors is truly remarkable. His paintings offer an intense and engaging visual experience that leaves a strong impression and makes the work truly memorable. The artistic techniques used, but above all, the themes addressed, contribute to conveying the message of nature conservation. The choice to use art as a tool to raise awareness about the importance of nature conservation is commendable. The artist seeks to reach as many people as possible worldwide, aiming to create a significant impact through his message.

Giovanni Merola was born in 1961 in Capua. The artistic disposition accompanies him in his childhood and adolescence, although he finds himself forced to abandon his studies becoming a Volunteer Military Engineer in the Railway Engineers. After several years he will attend the art school of Valdagno and the Cignaroli Academy in Verona. Today he lives in Innsbruck, where, in addition to his stay on the railway, he is part of a project dedicated to Maria Carolina Habsburg-Lorraine. From his homeland he brings with him the philosophy of never giving up, because as E. De Filippo, great of the Neapolitan theater wrote, "The exams never end". His works are born from a sudden illumination: Merola sees something that attracts his attention and imagines it under certain specific light, color, and composition reflections, and he begins to experiment until he finds what strikes him most emotionally. In the last period he has dedicated himself to the pictorial project Intrusive Plastic, choosing specific subjects, reworking, and transforming them: each work is a symbol of awareness and desire to preserve nature, trying, in this way of expressing himself for the protection of the environment, to achieve and raise awareness with your message as many people as possible in the world.1

A transformation of emotional details of the soul and unconscious fears, described through a clear and ethereal technique. His art is the sublime realisation of the unreal dream, with the transfiguration of reality in an aesthetic dimension of immediate communicative appeal, thought-provoking.

The artist demonstrates a masterful ability to dose chromatic tones in a perfect harmonic balance of the whole with creative developments of his research that points towards strong current emotions. His pictorial elaborations show essential gestures in continuous movement, with compositional developments and translations of an accusatory reality that trace narrative actions with an emotional filter.

A sublime use of cold colours, almost as if to perceive frost as a metaphor for the solitude of the subjects depicted, set in golden, uncontaminated surroundings. The stroke is confident, juxtaposing lighter and darker colours and converging towards clearer details with the aim of always keeping the value of the whole high. Rosanna Chetta, 2021⁴.

An artist who enters an Eduard Hopper-inspired world that borders on Pop Art hyperrealism, especially in two of his works, Cuba and Miss America. In both cases, his remarkable mastery of drawing and colour is key. In one, the author tells us how an ankle and a heel, the symbolic expression of a bursting femininity, can be placed in a context that takes us back to the sixties and makes us relive that atmosphere, all with a simple framing of just three details: the car bumper, the ankle and the amazing heel. On the other hand, he offers us the sliver of the classic car, reflective lights on whose body or bumper the images of the surrounding world are reflected. There are other works, not included in the above, that are the result of further research by the artist to define other figurative devices that move towards surreal expressionism, such as Ecstasy and Emotional Contrast. I would include Pop Bottle among the light experiences he has made to show the artist's ability to play with light and reflections and to create situations that can be easily inserted into everyday life.
